Lynn Kwiatkowski teaches courses in cultural anthropology at Colorado State University in the Department of Anthropology. She received her Ph.D. in 1994 from the joint program in medical anthropology at the University of California, at Berkeley and the University of California, San Francisco. Her research focuses on medical anthropology, gender, and critical studies of development in the Philippines, in Vietnam, and in Vietnamese communities in the U.S. Her research in the Philippines examined hunger and development among upland Ifugao people of northern Luzon Island, resulting in her book *Struggling with Development: The Politics of Hunger and Gender in the Philippines*. Her current research investigates wife battering in Vietnam and in Vietnamese communities in the U.S. Most recently she has been focusing on the impact of transnational processes on local approaches to alleviating wife battering in Vietnam and on battered Vietnamese women's health.
